

On Global Citizenship: James Tully in Dialogue (Critical Powers)

James Tully is one of the world's most influential and distinctive political philosophers. Drawing on a diverse range of traditions in political theory, his research programme in 'public philosophy' was first outlined in his prize-winning two volume work *Public Philosophy in a New Key*, published in 2009. In this work, Tully develops a historical approach to political philosophy that enters into dialogue with subjects engaged in struggles against injustice and oppression.

On Global Citizenship further develops this approach via a wide-ranging dialogue between Tully and leading contemporaries. In his lead essay, Tully applies his distinctive philosophy to the global field of citizenship. The second part of the book contains essays offering rigorous critical engagement with the ideas contained in Tully's lead essay and with his approach to political philosophy more generally. The volume closes with a response from Tully to his critics.

This is the opening volume in Bloomsbury's *Critical Powers* series of dialogues between authors and their critics. It offers a stimulating read for students and scholars of political theory and philosophy, especially those engaged with questions of citizenship. It is an ideal first source for academics and students wishing to engage with Tully's work.

He is a fellow of the Royal Society of Canada and an Emeritus Fellow of the Trudeau Foundation. His publications include *Strange Multiplicity: Constitutionalism in an Age of Diversity* (1995) and *Public Philosophy in a New Key* (2009, 2 volumes), the winner of the C. B. Macpherson Prize in 2010. Tully was the recipient of a Killam Prize for the Humanities in 2010, awarded by the Canada Council for the Arts in recognition of his distinguished career and outstanding contribution to scholarship.
